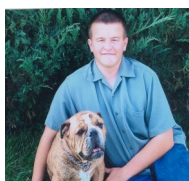
Dustin Frank

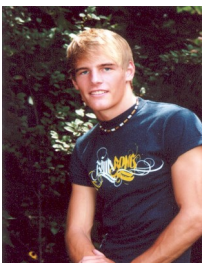
Kathryn Gerwig

Emily Kindvall

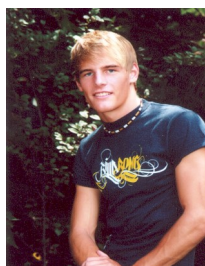

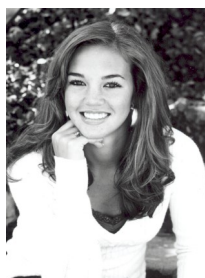
Britney Sappington
